STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Regulating Fishing in Massachusetts Gore, in the
County of Franklin.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Fishing in Massachusetts Gore. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in any brook or stream situated in Massachusetts Gore, in the county of Franklin; provided, however, that in Massachusetts Bog between the dam at the foot of the bog and the boat landing at the upper end of the bog it shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time except in the ordinary way of casting with artificial flies or fly-fishing, so-called, or to transport any fish except from the place where caught to a lodge, camp, dwelling house or hotel situated in Davis, Stetson, or Seven Ponds township or in said Massachusetts Gore.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in possession any kind of fish at any time taken in violation of any provision of this section.

Sect. 2. Penalty for violation. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the general penalty provided in section one hundred seven of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes for violation of the fish and game laws.
