STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Regulating Fishing in Coburn Gore, in the County of Franklin.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Brooks and streams in Coburn Gore closed to all fishing. It shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in any brook or stream situated in Coburn Gore, in the county of Franklin.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in possession any kind of fish at any time taken in violation of any provision of this section.

Sect. 2. Penalty for violation. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to the general penalty provided in section one hundred seven of chapter thirty-eight of the revised statutes for violation of the fish and game laws.
