## STATE OF MAINE

---

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

---

AN ACT to provide for the appointment of a commission on pensions for state employees.

---

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. The governor with the advice and consent of the Council, shall appoint five citizens of the state who are members of the eighty-fifth Legislature, two of whom shall have been members of the Senate and three of whom shall have been members of the House of Representatives. Said commissioners shall serve without pay but shall be reimbursed for their actual expenses incurred while engaged on the duties of said commission. They shall meet as soon as convenient after their appointment at such place as they may select, and shall choose one of their number to be Chairman of the commission. Said commission shall hold such hearings as it may deem necessary and shall study and consider the advisability of legislation to take the place of the present provisions for pensions for state employees.

Sect. 2. Said commission shall on or before January one, nineteen hundred and thirty-three make a written report to the governor and council which report shall be transmitted to the clerk of the house of Representatives upon the organization of the eighty-sixth legislature and which said report shall include such recommendations for legislation as the commis-

sion may adopt for a comprehensive system of pensions for state employees.

Sect. 3. The sum of one thousand dollars is hereby appropriated for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this act.
