STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Pensions for Members of the Police
Department of the City of Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Amend section one of chapter seventy-five of the private and special laws of nineteen hundred and twenty-seven, by striking out the whole of said section and inserting in place thereof the following:

'Section 1. Retirement pension for police department provided for; conditions. The city of Portland is authorized to, and shall, provide, by ordinance, for the retirement, upon pension of not less than half pay of the regular salary at all times, of all the members of its police force, including the chief of police, captains, lieutenants, sergeants and patrolmen who have been honorably discharged from the police force by reason of:

1. Having served on said police force not less than twenty-five (25) consecutive years;
2. Having served on the police force not less than twenty (20) consecutive years and having reached the age of sixty-five (65) years;
3. Having been permanently disabled in the performance of duty.'
