STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Steam and Gasoline Engines.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section twenty-four of chapter twenty-six is hereby amended, by striking out in line one thereof after the word "stationary" the word "gasoline" and substituting therefor the words 'internal combustion', so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 24. Stationary, internal combustion, or steam engine not to be used without license from town officers. No stationary, internal combustion, or steam engine shall be erected in a town until the municipal officers have granted license therefor, designating the place where the buildings therefor shall be erected, the materials and mode of construction, the size of the boiler and furnace, and such provision as to height of chinney or flues, and protection against fire and explosion, as they judge proper for the safety of the neighborhood. Such license shall be granted on written application, recorded in the town records, and a certified copy of it furnished, without charge, to the applicant.'
