STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Regulating the Transportation of Poultry.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter one hundred forty of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto the following section, to be numbered thirty-one D, and to read as follows:

'Sect. 31D. Transportation of poultry at night; penalty. No person, firm or corporation shall transport poultry of any description upon any public highway between the hours of seven o'clock in the evening and five o'clock in the morning without a license so to do. The aforesaid license may be issued by the commissioner of agriculture without cost to the applicant for the calendar year if he is satisfied of the responsibility and character of the applicant.

Any violation of this section shall be punished by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars or by imprisonment for not more than six months or by both such fine and imprisonment.'
