IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT for the Promotion of Temperance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Chapter twenty-three of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after section twenty-four of said chapter a new section to be numbered twenty-four A, to read as follows:

'Sect. 24A. Record of sales of certain extracts; penalty. Whoever sells any flavoring extract containing more than one-half of one per cent of alcohol by volume shall keep a record of such sales, the name and quantity of the article sold and the name and residence of the person or persons to whom it was delivered, which record shall be made before the article was delivered and shall be open to inspection by any sheriff or deputy sheriff, or by the police authorities and the officers of cities and towns. Whoever neglects to keep or refuses to show to said officers such record shall be punished by a fine of not more than fifty dollars.'
