STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Agricultural Societies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section thirty-five of chapter thirty-nine of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting in the second line of said section after the word "merchandise" the following words: 'or rents ground space for automobile parking purposes,' so that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 35. Sale of merchandise and refreshments, parking space, and exhibitions, near grounds restricted. Whoever sells any refreshments, or other merchandise, or rents ground space for automobile parking purposes, or exhibits any show or play, within a quarter of a mile of the fair grounds of any agricultural society, during the time of any exhibition thereof, unless in his own dwelling-house, or usual and ordinary place of business or lets any land or building adjoining, or overlooking the fair grounds of such society, to spectators of any exhibition thereof, during the time of such exhibition, without the written consent of its trustees, forfeits to such society not exceeding one hundred dollars, to be recovered on complaint of two of its trustees.'
