IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND THIRTY-ONE

AN ACT Establishing a Game Preserve in the towns of Vas-
salboro and Winslow in the County of Kennebec.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Game preserve established in the towns of Vas-
salboro and Winslow in the County of Kennebec. No person
shall at any time hunt, chase, catch, kill or destroy any wild
bird or wild animal within the property of the following named
persons to wit: New England Yearly Meeting of Friends, for
Oak Grove Seminary, William F. Glazier, Thomas G. Burleigh,
Levater W. Sanborn, Nettie C. Burleigh, Clara C. Burleigh,
Francis Nadeau, Theodora Thompson, Julian D. Taylor, Cora
Arey, John Kennedy, Gertrude Waldron Smith, Russell G.
Ayer, Bert Denico, Mary Cook, Thomas Starkey.

Sec. 2. Penalties for violations. Whoever violates any pro-
vision of this act shall be subject to the general penalty pro-
vided in section one hundred seven of chapter thirty-eight of
the revised statutes for violation of the fish and game laws.
