# STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Motor Vehicle License Plates for Rural Mail Carriers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. F. D. mail carriers may change motor vehicle plates.** Chapter 28 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting after section 55 of said chapter a new section to be numbered section 55-A and to read as follows:

'Sec. 55-A. **R. F. D. mail carriers may change plates.** Any rural free delivery mail carrier, who operates a motor vehicle registered according to law, and who finds it necessary or advisable to use some other motor vehicle to perform his duties as such carrier, may place the number plates issued for his registered motor vehicle upon such other motor vehicle while it is in such use; provided that he also places thereon plates bearing the words "U. S. Mail", the letters of which shall not be less than 3 inches in height.'
