STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Closing to all Fishing Moosehorn Stream and Tributaries, in the Towns of Charlotte and Baring, in the County of Washington.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. **Fishing in Moosehorn Stream and tributaries regulated.** For a period of 2 years from the time this act becomes effective, it shall be unlawful for any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in the waters of Moosehorn Stream or in any of the tributaries to said Moosehorn Stream, which waters are situated in the towns of Charlotte and Baring, in the county of Washington.

It shall also be unlawful for any person to have in possession at any time any kind of fish taken in violation of any of the provisions of this act.

Sec. 2. **Penalty.** Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be subject to a penalty of not more than \$300 and costs, or imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or both said fine and imprisonment.
