STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE

Memorial to the Congress of the United States, Urging It to Regulate the Hours of Labor.

Whereas, the eighty-sixth Legislature of the State of Maine, appreciating that injustice is done both to industries and to labor by reason of the diversity of the hours of labor required or permitted in the several states, makes the following recommendation:

Resolved: By the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Maine in Legislature assembled that we urge the Congress of the United States that Congress propose and submit to the several states an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which amendment shall give Congress power to regulate the hours of labor and make the same uniform throughout the United States; and be it further

Resolved: That certified copies of this resolution duly certified by the Secretary of State be forwarded to the President of the Senate and to the Speaker of the House of Representatives at Washington and to the several Senators and Representatives from the State of Maine in the Congress of the United States.
