STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Long Pond or Crescent Lake.

Fishing in Long Pond regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to issue a rule and regulation making it unlawful to plug fish in Long Pond in Sandy River Plantation in Franklin county or to kill any trout less than 10 inches in length or any salmon less than 14 inches or to have in possession more than 10 pounds of trout and salmon combined in any one day taken from said Long Pond.
