STATE OF MAINE<br>IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTYTHREE

AN ACT Relating to Fishing in Lake Pennesseewassee and Sand Pond.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:
Section I. Trout fishing in tributaries to Big Pennesseewassee. The tributaries to Big Lake Pennesseewassee are hereby opened to trout fishing under the general law.

Sec. 2. Smelt fishing in Big Pennesseewassee and Little Pennesseewassee and tributaries. It shall be unlawful to take smelts in any manner from Big Lake Pennesseewassee and Little Lake Pennesseewassee, and their tributaries.

Sec. 3. Ice fishing in Big Pennesseewassee. Big Lake Pennesseewassee is hereby opened to ice fishing under the general law.

Sec. 4. Trout limit in Big and Little Pennesseewassee and Sand Pond. It shall be unlawful for any person to take, catch and kill at any time in any one day more than 5 trout, from either Big Lake Pennesseewassee, Little Lake Pennesseewassee or Sand Pond, provided further that such catch shall not weigh more than io pounds.

Sec. 5. Black bass limit in Sand Pond. It shall be unlawful for the occupants of any one boat to take, catch and kill in any one day more than 5 black bass in Sand Pond.

Sec. 6. Penalty. Whoever violates any provision of this act shall be punished by the penalty in section 107 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes.
