STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Liability to Guest Riders.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Guest riders not to have cause of action for damages in case of accident; exceptions. No person transported as a guest by the owner or operator of a motor vehicle shall have a cause of action for damages against such owner or operator for injury, death, or financial loss, in case of accident, unless such accident shall have been caused by the gross negligence or wilful and wanton misconduct of the owner or operator of such motor vehicle, and unless such gross negligence or wilful and wanton misconduct contributed to the injury, death, or loss for which the action is brought.
