STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Pensions for Crippled Citizens.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Armless and legless citizens; pensions for. Whoever having incurred the loss of a limb, at or above the knee or elbow and having no visible means of support, and having been a resident of this state for five years immediately preceding such loss shall be pensioned as follows:

If one leg or arm is lost, \$20.00 per month;

If both legs or arms are lost, \$40.00 per month;

This pension to be paid one-half by the town in which they are resident, and one-half by the state.

This pension shall start from the date of the application thereof, and shall not apply to aliens, minors, or those receiving aid from the federal government.
