STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Town Meetings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S. c. 5, § 4, amended. Section 4 of chapter 5 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 4. Selectmen refusing, meeting how called. If the selectmen unreasonably refuse to call a town meeting, any ten or more number of legal voters therein not less than ten per cent of the voters registered in the biennial state election then last past may apply to a justice of the peace in the county, who may issue his warrant for calling such meeting. When ten or more any number of legal voters not less than ten per cent of the voters in writing registered in the biennial state election then last past request the selectmen to insert a particular thing in a warrant, they shall insert it in the next warrant issued, or shall call a special meeting for the consideration thereof.'
