STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Repealing the Bounty on Porcupines and Hedgehogs.

Emergency Preamble. Whereas, at this particular period the estimated and probable revenues of the state for the ensuing 2 years will be insufficient to meet the estimated expenditures of the state, based on the requirements of the law as now existing, and

Whereas, it is imperative that all expenditures not productive of a corresponding resulting benefit to the state be discontinued at once, and

Whereas, a bounty on hedgehogs and porcupines is such an expenditure, and

Whereas, the foregoing facts render the passage of this act immediately necessary for the preservation of public peace, health and safety and constitutes an emergency within the meaning of the constitution, now therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. **R. S. c. 38, § 78, repealed.** Section 78 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed.

Sec. 2. P. L. 1931, c. 249, repealed. Chapter 249 of the public laws of 1931 is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. Sections renumbered. Sections 79-109-A, inclusive of chapter 38 of the revised statutes are hereby renumbered to be from 78-109 respectively.

Emergency Clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.
