RESOLVE, Relating to Fishing in Cold Stream Pond.

Fishing in Cold Stream Pond, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to close to all fishing, except fly-fishing after June 1 each year, Cold Stream pond, in Cold Stream, Parlin Pond, and Misery townships; providing that there shall be a bag limit during such open season of not more than 5 pounds of trout and salmon in any one day to any one person.
