S T A T E O F M A I N E

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Relating to Fishing in Big King and Bartlett Lakes.

Fishing regulated in Big King and Bartlett lakes. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Big King and Bartlett lakes situated in township 4, range 5, B. K. P. W. K. R., to trout and salmon fishing, except by fly fishing or trolling, and to prohibit taking more than 10 such fish in any one day or more than 5 pounds of such fish unless the last fish taken increases the combined weight thereof to more than 5 pounds.
