STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT To Restrict School Expenditures in Towns to Funds Definitely Appropriated Therefor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Limitation on school expenses in towns. It shall be unlawful for the superintending school committee or the superintendent of schools in any town to expend any sum in the operation of the schools therein in excess of the fund appropriated for that purpose by the municipal officers or town meeting with the accretions to such fund which may be received in cash during the school year.

Sec. 2. Indebtedness for schools forbidden. It shall be unlawful for the superintending school committee or the superintendent of schools in any town to incur any indebtedness in the operation of schools.
