STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT to Provide for the Surrender by Drew Plantation of its Organization.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Organization of Drew Plantation may be surrendered. The organization of Drew Plantation in Penobscot county as heretofore adopted is hereby surrendered provided, however, that the corporate existence, powers, duties and liabilities of said plantation shall survive for the purpose of prosecuting and defending all pending suits and causes of suits to which said plantation is, or may be, a party and all needful process growing out of the same, including provisions for the payment of all or any judgments or debts which may be rendered against such town or exist in favor of any creditor.

Sec. 2. Effective date of act. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the first day of March, A. D., 1934.
