## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Employers of Labor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section I. Employers to furnish overseers of poor with record of wages paid. Overseers of the poor of any municipality in this state may furnish any employer of labor, employing regularly 5 or more workmen, with a list containing the names of any persons receiving or applying for aid in such municipality, and request that such employer furnish them with a statement of the earnings of the persons named on such list, in their employ, paid within one month immediately preceding the date on which said list was furnished. Such employer shall, within 10 days of the receipt of such list, furnish the overseers of the poor with a statement of the wages paid within one month immediately preceding the receipt of such list to all employees named therein.

Sec. 2. Penalty. Any person, firm or corporation violating the provisions of section I shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$15 for each offense.
