STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relative to the Hunting of Moose and Caribou; Importation of Same.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S. c. 38, § 60, amended. Section 60 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 60. Hunting and importation of moose and caribou regulated. No person shall hunt There shall be an annual closed season on moose and caribou during which period it is unlawful to kill, shoot, wound, pursue, trap, destroy or have in possession any moose, caribou or part thereof. Provided, however, that the commissioner of inland fisheries and game upon application of any person who has legally killed a caribou or moose beyond the limits of this state may issue a license permitting the importation of such caribou or moose for consumption or mounting, but not for sale.'
