STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to the Taking of Finger Prints and Photographs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 18 of c. 143 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 18. When authorized, state highway police, sheriffs or police departments shall take photographs and finger prints. Upon receipt of written authority from any superior or municipal courts in this state, the state highway police or the sheriffs of the several counties or the police departments of the several cities and towns shall have authority to take or cause to be taken the finger prints and photographs of any person in custody charged with the commission of a felony or of persons who are serving sentences in the state prison or in any one of the jails in the several counties of the state for the commission of a felony or misdemeanor.'
