STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relative to the Taking of Eels, Suckers, Horn Pouts, Yellow Perch and Alewives; Permits for Same.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S. c. 38, § 30, amended. Section 30 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'The commissioner of inland fisheries and game may grant permits to take suckers, eels, horn pouts, alewives and yellow perch for market, by means of eel pots, traps, spears, or nets, in inland waters frequented by these fish, under such terms, rules and regulations as he may establish, but no exclusive territory permits shall be granted for the taking of any of said fish in any inland waters. Provided, further, that such commissioner may grant permits to take alewives in the inland waters of the state under such rules and regulations as he may establish.

'It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to take any of the above mentioned fish for market until he has obtained a permit so to do from the said commissioner.'
