STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to the Tributaries of Springy Pond, Hatcase Pond, Mountainy Pond, Burnt Pond, in the Counties of Hancock and Penobscot.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Fishing in tributaries of Springy, Hatcase, Mountainy and Burnt Ponds regulated. The commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to issue a rule and regulation forbidding any person to fish for, take, catch or kill any kind of fish at any time in any of the tributaries to Springy Pond, sometimes known as Spectacle Pond, in the Town of Clifton, County of Penobscot, and in the Town of Otis, County of Hancock; or in the tributaries to Hatcase Pond, in the Town of Eddington, County of Penobscot, and in the Town of Dedham, County of Hancock; or in the tributaries to Mountainy Pond, in the Town of Dedham, County of Hancock; or in the tributaries to Burnt Pond in the Towns of Otis, Clifton and Dedham, in the Counties of Penobscot and Hancock, and any person to have in his possession at any time any kind of fish taken in violation of the provisions of this rule and regulation.
