STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Notice in Probate Proceedings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S. c. 75, § 50, amended. Section 50 of chapter 75 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 50. Notice in probate proceedings, defined. In laws relating to probate courts and proceedings, the words "public notice" denote notice published three weeks successively in a newspaper published in the county whose court has jurisdiction, or in which the deceased last dwelt, or a newspaper published in an adjoining county, if of larger circulation, as ordered by the judge, or, if none, in the state paper; the words "personal notice" denote service by a copy given in hand, or left at the place of last and usual abode, seven days at least before the time of hearing: and the words "due notice" denote public or personal notice, at the discretion of the judge.'
