STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Appropriations Dealing with Indian Affairs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Lump sum appropriations not required for Indian affairs. Section 7 of c. 216 of the public laws of 1931 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 7. Form of appropriation bill. The appropriation bill provided for in section 4 of this article shall be drawn in such form as to authorize only lump sum appropriations to meet the expenditure needs of the various departments and agencies of the state government, except departments and agencies dealing with Indian affairs, for each fiscal year of the biennium. For the operation and maintenance expenses of each department or agency, there shall be a single appropriation which shall be allotted before becoming available for expenditure as provided for in a subsequent section of this act. Appropriations for the acquisition of property shall be in such detail under each department or agency as the governor shall determine; provided, however, that such appropriation shall not be segregated in greater detail than the major classes or projects for which they are expendable during each fiscal year of the biennium.'
