STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Superintending School Committees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S. c. 19, § 38, amended. Section 38 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 38. Superintending school committees; compensation. Each member of the superintending school committees shall be paid for his services not less than \$3.00 for every day necessarily and actually employed in the service of the town. Towns having 3000 or more inhabitants, may vote to pay their school committeemen not exceeding \$5.00 a day for the time actually spent in the service of the town and a town having less than 3000 inhabitants, may by majority vote at its annual meeting fix the compensation of its school committee at not less than \$3.00 per day, allowing such sum as may be commensurate with the duties of the office, with traveling expenses.'
