STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT to Provide for the Appointment of a Commission to Simplify and Expedite Civil Procedure in the Courts of Maine.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Section 1. Commission to simplify and expedite civil procedure in the courts of Maine. The governor with the advice and consent of the council, shall appoint 9 citizens of the state, at least one of whom shall be from the senate of the 86th legislature, 2 of whom shall be from the members of the house of representatives of the 86th legislature, 3 justices of the supreme judicial court or the superior court and 3 members of the bar, for the purpose of recommending to the 87th legislature a bill or bills designed to simplify and expedite civil procedure in the courts of Maine.

- Sec. 2. Expenses paid. Members of this commission shall serve without pay, but shall be reimbursed for their actual expenses.
- Sec. 3. Appropriation. The sum of \$500.00 is hereby appropriated for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this act.
