STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Mary L. Merrill of Gardiner.

Pension provided for Mary L. Merrill. Resolved: That a pension of \$12 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Mary L. Merrill, of Gardiner, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mary L. Merrill is the daughter of Frank L. Merrill, who served in Co. I, 31st Maine Regiment, during the Civil War. She is only 54 years of age but because of a bad heart and high blood pressure is not able to work, and her means are practically exhausted. She is in need of financial assistance and is worthy of help. At the present time, a niece is caring for her, but is not financially able to continue doing so.
