STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Arria S. Sargent of Auburn.

Pension provided for Arria S. Sargent. Resolved: That a pension of \$20 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Arria S. Sargent, of Auburn, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Arria S. Sargent is the mother of Harry L. Sargent who had honorable service in the First Maine Heavy Artillery, during the Spanish War, and who is now deceased.

Mrs. Sargent is 80 years of age and in very feeble health as the result of a broken hip. She has been on crutches for the past seven years.

She is receiving \$12.00 per month from the State, which is the maximum amount which can be allowed under the general law on account of the service of a Spanish War veteran. This amount, with her Federal pension of \$12.00 per month, is not sufficient for her comfortable support. She is a worthy person and greatly in need of assistance.
