STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Rufus V. Libby, of Thomaston.

Pension provided for Rufus V. Libby. Resolved: That a pension of \$25 per month be and hereby is, granted to Rufus V. Libby, of Thomaston, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Rufus V. Libby is the son of Benjamin Libby, who served in Co. B, 24th Maine Regiment, during the Civil War, and was honorably discharged. Mr. Libby was so badly injured in 1924 that he has a permanent disability, and will never be able to do manual labor again. He is 57 years of age, is married and has two daughters, one of whom is married, the other in school. The married daughter is unable to be of assistance to the family as she is not living with her husband, and has all that she can do to support herself and her one child who is dependent upon her.

Mrs. Libby's health is very poor, and they do not own a home or any property.
