STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for an Increase in State Pension for Mary J. French of Carmel.

Pension of Mary J. French increased. Resolved: That a pension of \$15 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Mary J. French, of Carmel, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature, and shall be in lieu of the state pension which she is now receiving.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mary J. French is the daughter of David Hewey, who served in Co. E, 1st Maine Regiment of Heavy Artillery, during the Civil War. His service was from August 9, 1863, to September 11, 1865. She was granted a pension of \$12 per month by Chapter 54 of the Resolves of 1927, but the same is not sufficient for her needs.
