STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Alida Jackson of Waldo.

Pension provided for Alida Jackson. Resolved: That a pension of \$10 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Alida Jackson, of Waldo, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Alida Jackson is the daughter of Daniel G. Marden who served in Co. G, 4th Reg. of Inf., Maine Vols., during the Civil War. She is 76 years of age and no longer able to work. Her sons are not financially able to support her, and she will be obliged to have help from the town unless she is granted aid by the state.
