# STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for an Increase in State Pension for Kate Bird of Farmingdale.

Kate Bird, pension for. Resolved: That a pension of \$12 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Kate Bird, of Farmingdale, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and shall continue until otherwise provided by the legislature, and shall be in lieu of the state pension which she is now receiving.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

Kate Bird is the daughter of Edward Bird who served in Company I, 24th Maine Infantry, during the Civil War, and was honorably discharged.

Kate Bird was granted a pension of \$8.00 per month under the provisions of Chapter 98, Resolves of 1931. She is nearly 71 years of age and is very feeble. She does a little canvassing but earns very little, and she is in a destitute condition and in urgent need of further assistance.
