STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for an Increase in State Pension for Harry E. Troop, of Pittston.

Harry E. Troop; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of \$15 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Harry E. Troop, of Pittston, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature, and shall be in lieu of the state pension he is now receiving.
