STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Clara M. Ware, of Pittston.

Clara M. Ware; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of \$10 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Clara M. Ware, of Pittston, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Clara M. Ware is the daughter of Lewis Moody, who served in the Aroostook War. She is 72 years of age and has no one financially able to assist her. She is very feeble, and will soon become a town charge if she is not helped by the state. Her condition is very pitiable.
