STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Sidney Potter, of Gardiner.

Sidney Potter; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of \$15 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Sidney Potter, of Gardiner, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Sidney Potter is the son of Simeon Potter who had honorable service in Company E, 24th Maine Infantry, during the Civil War. He is 73 years of age and mentally deficient. As the result of an automobile accident, he has lost his leg and has become a great care. He is receiving a Government pension of \$20.00 per month and also State Aid under the general law, but the maximum amount of State Aid which can be paid under the general law is not sufficient for his needs. He is in a pitiable condition.
