STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Frank Cunningham, of Washington.

Frank Cunningham; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of \$8 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Frank Cunningham, of Washington, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Frank Cunningham is the son of Thomas Cunningham of Montville, who enlisted Sept. 10, 1862. The records in the office of the Adjutant General of this state show that he deserted Oct. 23, 1862, but this record is erroneous as the War Department at Washington, D. C., have on record that he was left at Bangor, Maine, with a broken arm, and was honorably discharged for disability on Nov. 15, 1862.

Frank Cunningham is 67 years of age; his health is no good and he is without sufficient means for the support of himself and wife.
