STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

RESOLVE, Creating an Unemployment Insurance Committee.

Committee on unemployment insurance, created. Resolved: That the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, shall appoint a committee of not more than 5 members which shall be known as the "Committee on Unemployment Insurance." The committee shall meet as soon as convenient after appointment and organize by choosing a chairman and secretary.

Such committee shall consider the necessity and feasibility of unemployment insurance legislation for this state; consult laws of other states on said subject and determine, so far as possible, the success other states are experiencing with such laws, and submit a report to the 87th legislature.

Members of said committee shall receive their actual expenses and such per diem compensation as may be approved by the governor and council; provided, however, that not more than \$300 is expended for the purposes of this act.
