STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Roadside Improvement.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- **Sec. 1. Planting.** The state highway commission may, subject to the consent of abutting land owners, cause or allow grasses, shrubs, vines, and trees to be planted and maintained along state and state aid highways, to be paid for as part of the cost of construction and maintenance of highways. This cost not to exceed \$500 per year.
- Sec. 2. New contracts. The state highway commission may enter into agreements with individuals or organizations who wish to plant grasses, vines, trees or flowers; or to make gifts or appropriations to carry out the provisions of this act.
- Sec. 4. Not to obstruct view of advertising panels. This act shall not be construed to permit the planting of trees, grasses, shrubs, vines, or flowers in any manner so as to prevent passers-by from having a clear and unobstructed view of any outdoor advertising panel.
