STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to the Term of Office of Members of the Police Department of the City of Bangor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. Members of police department to be retired at age of 65. When any policeman, patrolman, watchman or keeper of the city of Bangor shall have arrived at the age of 65 years he shall be deemed to be incapacitated for further useful service in said department and shall be honorably discharged by the city council.
- Sec. 2. Members of police department may be retired at age of 60. Any member of said department over 60 years of age may be retired by the city council upon application of the city manager, bearing the certificate of the civil service commission that said member is incapacitated for further useful service in said department.
- Sec. 3. Exceptions. Nothing in this act shall be construed to prevent the voluntary retirement of any member of said department at the age of 60, and any member so retiring shall enjoy all the privileges now enjoyed by members of said department heretofore retired at the age of 60.
