STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Regulating the Wages of Employees on State Highways

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Wages and hours of those employed on state highways regulated. No person shall be employed on the improvement, upkeeping or construction of state highways more than 40 hours in any I week.

The wages of those employed on state highways, that come under the following classifications, shall be as follows:

Foreman \$8.00 per day
Subforeman
Timekeeper \$6.00 per day
Shovel Operator
Shovel Helper
Skilled laborers, levellers and graders \$.75 per hour
Unskilled laborers \$.55 per hour
Truck drivers, hydraulic \$.55 per hour
Truck drivers, hand dump \$.50 per hour
Trucks, hydraulic, 1½ yard \$1.20 per hour
Trucks, hand dump, 1½ yard\$1.00 per hour
Larger trucks according to capacity.

The state shall provide for the transportation of the employees so employed, to and from work.
