IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Regarding the Wages of Employees on Public Works Under State Supervision

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Minimum wage scale. The following schedule of wages shall be the minimum wage scale for employees that come under the following named classifications, employed in the construction or repair of public buildings under state supervision:

Foreman	\$1.00 per hour
Subforeman85 per hour
Timekeeper75 per hour
Shovel operator	1.00 per hour
Shovel helper65 per hour
Common laborers60 per hour
Frame workers for foundations	1.00 per hour
Cement workers	1.00 per hour
Steel framers	1.20 per hour
Bricklayers, plasterers, masons, carpenters and painters ..	1.00 per hour
Helpers, hodcarriers, mortar mixers75 per hour

This schedule of wages shall be incorporated in all contracts let by the

state for such construction and repairs. Thirty hours shall constitute a week's work. In securing employees, members of trade unions shall be given the preference if same can be obtained in 48 hours. In all disputes or controversies arising on such construction or repairs under the above schedule, the commissioner of labor is hereby empowered to investigate and issue a finding—the decision of the commissioner of labor to be final.
