STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND
THIRTY-THREE

AN ACT Relating to Advertising of Intoxicating Liquors for Sale.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 137, § 14, amended. Section 14 of chapter 137 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 14. Advertising liquors for sale; penalty. Whoever advertises or gives notice of the sale or keeping for sale of intoxicating liquors, or knowingly publishes any newspaper in which such notices are given, shall be punished by a fine of \$20 and costs, to be recovered by complaint. One-half of said fine shall be paid to the complainant and $\frac{1}{2}$ to the town in which said notice is published. **Nothing in this section shall be construed, however, to forbid the advertising of liquors to be sold outside of this state or to be sold in this state in accordance with any provision of law therefor.'**
