STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

AN ACT Relating to the Ferry between Indian Island and Old Town.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1913, c. 132, § 5, amended. Section 5 of chapter 132 of the private and special laws of 1913 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 5. Members of tribe shall elect a ferryman. The members of the said tribe shall at their annual meeting held on the first Monday in April 2nd Tuesday in September of each year, elect by majority vote a suitable ferryman who shall be in charge of said ferry during the following year, such election being however subject to the approval of the agent of the tribe.'
- Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1913, c. 132, amended. Chapter 132 of the private and special laws of 1913 is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 6-A and to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 6-A. Monthly report. The governor of the tribe shall call a meeting of the tribe once each month at which a report shall be made of the receipts from the operation of the ferry and the disbursements.'
