# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

#### AN ACT Relating to State Armories.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 5, § 72, amended.** Section 72 of chapter 5 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 72. Armory commission granted certain powers and duties regarding construction and repair of armories. The armory commission is hereby authorized to order and supervise the construction of buildings to be used as armories for the purpose of the use of the national guard of the state of Maine, and to repair and improve buildings donated for that purpose. Whenever a town or any person shall deed to the state of Maine any lot or lots, or lot or lots and buildings thereon to be used by the state for the purpose of constructing an armory, the armory commission is authorized to accept such gift provided that sufficient funds are available to carry out the project. There is hereby appropriated the sum of \$50,000, annually, for the before mentioned purposes. Any unexpended balance shall be carried forward for the aforesaid mentioned purposes, and shall not lapse.'
