STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN

RESOLVE, in Favor of a Memorial to the Maine Volunteer Signal Corps.

Memorial to Maine's Volunteer Signal Corps; authorized. Resolved: That to fittingly honor the services of the Maine Volunteer Signal Corps in the War with Spain, it being the first Maine volunteer company to ever serve on foreign soil, and to commemorate its services to mankind in freeing an oppressed people from foreign tyranny: a suitable bronze tablet upon which the names of this company be inscribed, mounted on Maine granite, be erected in or near the city of Santiago de Cuba;

That the sum of not more than \$5000 be and hereby is appropriated from the contingent fund, or from such other funds that are now or shall be available during the year of 1937, for this purpose, and

That a committee consisting of I member of the senate and 2 members of the house and 3 surviving members of the Maine Volunteer Signal Corps, of the War with Spain, be appointed to carry out the provisions of this resolve.
